CD Discussion of the differences between 'traditional treatments' (e.g., lithium, Prozac, &, etc.) and 'alternative methods' (e.g., nutrients, vitamins, etc. one could buy in GNC stores, acupuncture, chiropractic procedures + all sorts of other therapies). The main point of the talk is to differentiate between the two categories. An important point is that alternative can become traditional after vigorous scientific testing. Not with anecdotal evidence or a friend saying, 'Gee! That worked for me!' In 1948 John Cade came up with lithium -- at first after only 10 patients being given lithium it was an alternative treatment. Now after 60 years, countless studies and the improvement of scores of millions of patients (and the benefit/cost ratio is positive), it is now a traditional scientifically validated drug treatment. At times a treatment is validated -- but, then new information comes to be known as more people are exposed to the treatment and the treatment is withdrawn: Thalidomide, Vioxx... (07/29/09)

At times a treatment is validated -- but, then new information comes to be known as more people are exposed to the treatment and the treatment is withdrawn: Thalidomide, Vioxx... (07/29/09)
